4. IMPACT FACTOR

The Impact factor is determined by dividing the number of current citation to papers published in the two previous years by the total number of paper published in these two years.

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Manuscripts submitted to **Malaya Journal of Biosciences (MJB)** should not have been published earlier or be under simultaneous consideration for publication by any other journal. Violation may lead to a retraction of the published article by the journal and other actions as deemed necessary by the editor. All articles (including invited ones) will be peer-reviewed, followed by editing of the accepted articles according to the guidelines of the style-sheet approved for the journal. Accepted manuscripts become the permanent property of the journal and may not be reproduced, in whole or in part, without the written permission of the editor.

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1. Original Research Papers (Regular Papers)
2. Review Articles
3. Short Communications (Mini reviews)

Original Research Papers should report the results of original research. The material should not have been previously published elsewhere, except in a preliminary form.

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- Regular reviews covering subjects falling within the scope of the journal which are of active current interest.
- Mini-reviews. These will be short reviews or overviews on topics of above mentioned fields.

Note: Malaya Journal of Biosciences gives authors the freedom and flexibility to publish more extensive accounts of their novel research without page restrictions.

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Manuscript Preparation

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Formatting order: Manuscript should be divided into Title page, Abstract, Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion or Results and Discussion, Conclusion, Acknowledgements, References.

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A concise and factual abstract is required of no more than 400 words. The abstract should state briefly the purpose of the research, the principal results and major conclusions.
